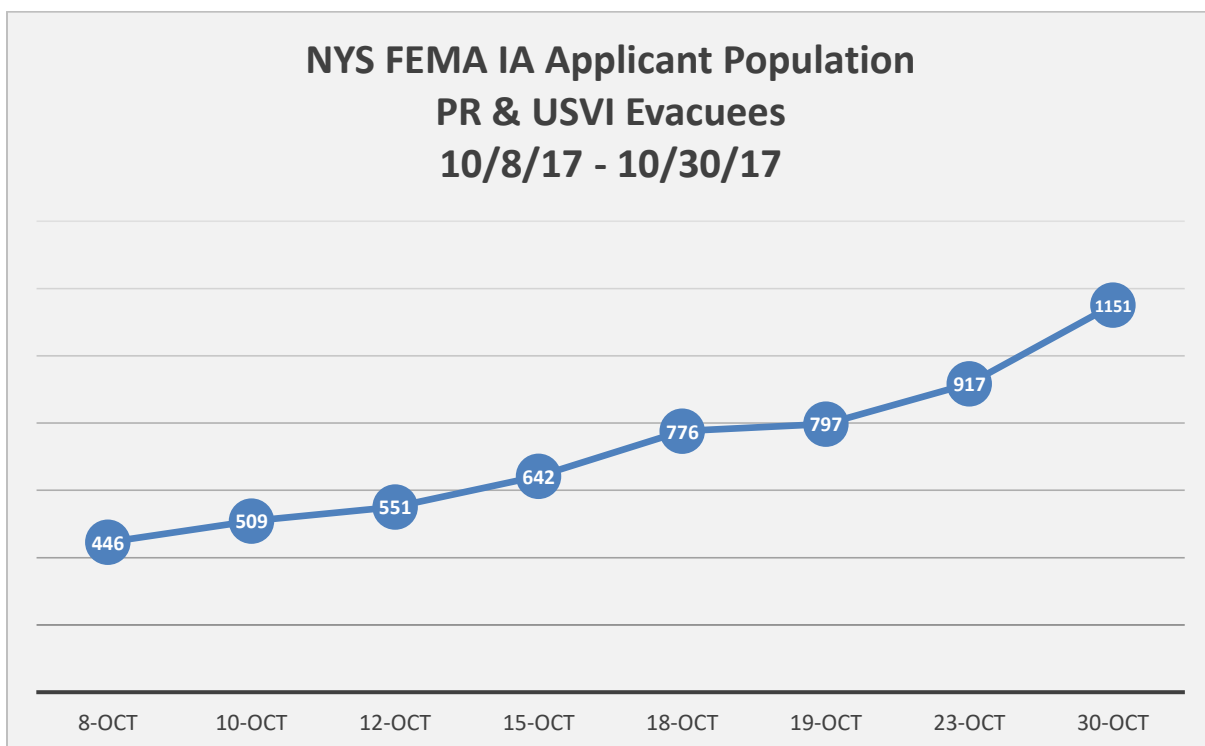




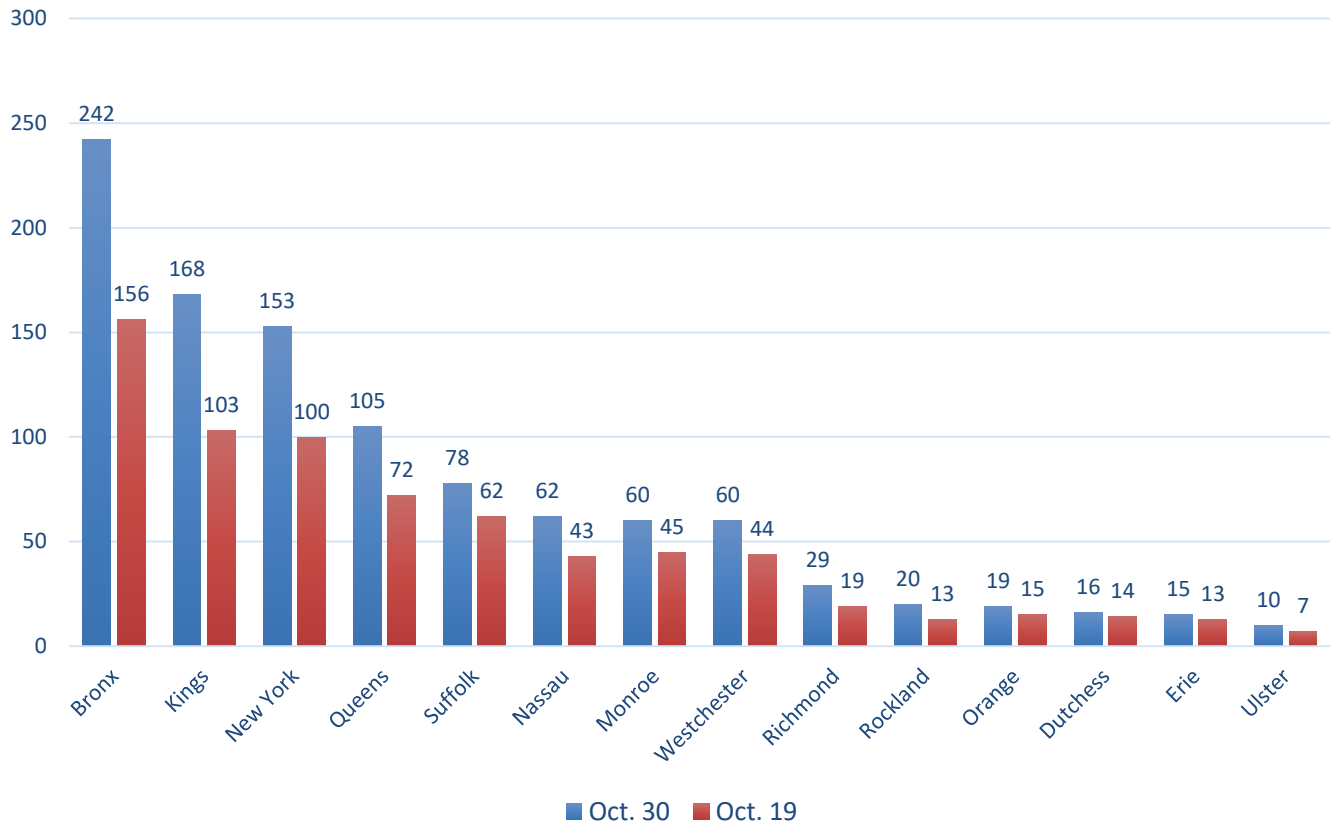
Puerto Rico & U.S. Virgin Islands Evacuees in New York 10/31/2017

Overview

- As of 10/30/2017, there were 1,151 FEMA Individual Assistance (IA) applicants with a NYS address change.
 - 697 in New York City, 140 on Long Island, and 314 elsewhere in the state.
 - Since 10/19, 54% increase in NYC, 33% increase on Long Island, and 32% increase in the rest of the state.
- The City of New York opened a Hurricane Evacuee Services Center on 10/19.
 - As of 10/29, 573 households from Puerto Rico and USVI have visited the Center.
 - Many evacuees have unmet needs including temporary and permanent housing, food, clothing, and employment. 85% report during exit interviews that they have remaining unmet needs (see page 3.)
- On 10/30, FEMA announced that [Transitional Sheltering Assistance \(TSA\) is available to those displaced from Puerto Rico.](#)
 - “Transitional Sheltering Assistance allows eligible applicants to shelter in a hotel or motel, for a limited period of time, as a bridge to intermediate and longer-term housing.” TSA also includes transportation to the Continental United States.

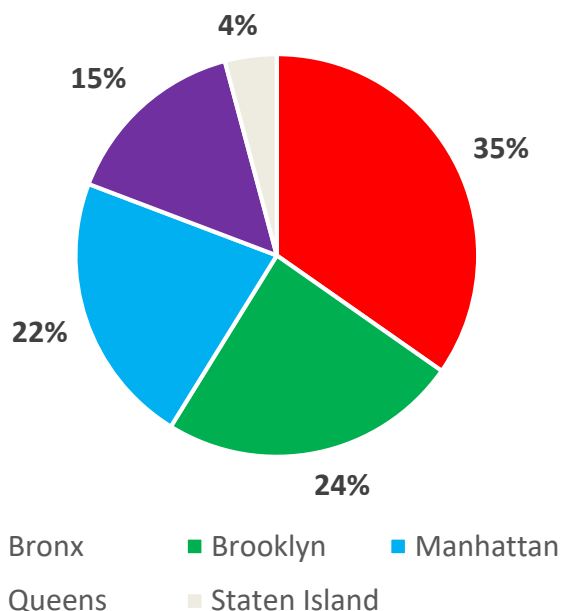
